



# WHAT TO WEAR?

## OFFICIAL UNIFORM

For daily wear, all students are required to wear a uniform comprised of any combination of the following items supplied only by the school's designated supplier. Which can be purchased through the "Uniform Committee". These items are pants, shorts, kilts, sweaters, tunics and blouses, in set colours (navy, white, beige, grey and powder blue). Students may purchase their own leggings or socks to wear with their uniform, in the same colours as their uniform. Students are also required to wear their uniforms to any field trips and class outings.

## MANDATORY UNIFORM DAYS

For special events where HCS is hosting an audience the "Mandatory Uniform" is required. (Examples of these events would be: The Christmas Performance, Celebration of Learning Night, etc.) The "Official Uniform" is a navy top with khaki bottom, navy top with a kilt, or white blouse with navy jumper. The administration will let parents know before events through the weekly newsletter if the official uniform is required. Every student must own a "Mandatory Uniform".

## SPIRIT WEAR DAYS

HCS "Spirit Wear" can be purchased at the start of each school year. "Spirit Wear" is t-shirts, sweaters, jogging pants and shorts featuring the school name and logo, which come in youth and adult sizes. In the fall the administration will send out an order form and have samples available of these items which can be purchased at that time. **(Families are not required to purchase the items.)** On the 3rd Wednesday of each month there will be "Spirit Wear Wednesday". This day students may wear any HCS Spirit Wear clothing in replacement of their uniform. (For example, they may swap their uniform polo for an HCS Spirit Wear T-shirt.) This is NOT a dress down day. Students may not wear jeans or other jogging pants, short, t-shirts or hoodies.

## DRESS DOWN DAYS

The "HCS Student Council" will periodically have a "Dress Down Day" where students can dress up according to a theme selected by them. Students who want to participate are asked to pay 25 cents and then do not have to wear their school uniform that day. **(Families are not required to participate. Students may wear their uniform and not pay 25 cents on that day if they prefer.)** Parents can work with their student to interpret the theme and participating students are not required to wear any part of their uniform. (For example, "Crazy Sock Day" students may wear any pants or shirt they prefer with their crazy socks.) All clothing must still maintain the general dress code which require neatness and modesty.
